Greetings!

2020 was a memorable and challenging year for us all yet, I am happy to report that it remained a productive one for the AALAS Foundation.

Our donors' support in 2020 allowed the Foundation to distribute over 22,000 pieces of free educational outreach materials to teachers, students, Branches, and AALAS members. We were also able to participate and exhibit at the 2020 USA Science & Engineering's virtual Expo – attended by more than 75,000 students, teachers, and parents.

Our contributors' and volunteers' support allowed us to expand our "Celebrate Animal Research & Education (CARE) outreach program in 2020. A new "CARE" YouTube channel was created along with a total of seven (7) videos which were developed to inform and educate the public about the variety of ways animals have helped advance medical research. The CARE YouTube channel and video compliments the growing collection of free, speaker-ready, fully scripted, "What's Happening in Research?" Power Point presentations.

With our donors' help, the AALAS Foundation continues to identify new avenues, technologies and trends in order to connect with students and the general public. The 2020 Celebrate the Mouse Biomedical Research Video Essay Contest" was advertised across the country and we received entries from seven states. The students submitted creative and educational videos highlighting the use of mice in medical discoveries. Thanks, also, to the support of our donors, we were able to award trophies and over \$2,500 in prizes to student winners of the 2020 "Celebrate the Mouse Biomedical Research Video Essay" contest.

Our supporters' enthusiasm for the AALAS Foundation enables us to continue showcasing our public outreach materials at national educational conferences and helps us spread the word about our free resource materials for teachers. We continue to maintain and enhance our www.care.aalas.org website and the www.kids4research.org website.

On behalf of the AALAS Foundation Board of Directors, I would like to thank everyone who has supported the AALAS Foundation. Whether you made a contribution, purchased one of our "Heroes in Biomedical Research" t-shirts or masks, or participated in a public outreach program in your community, we truly appreciate your continued support.

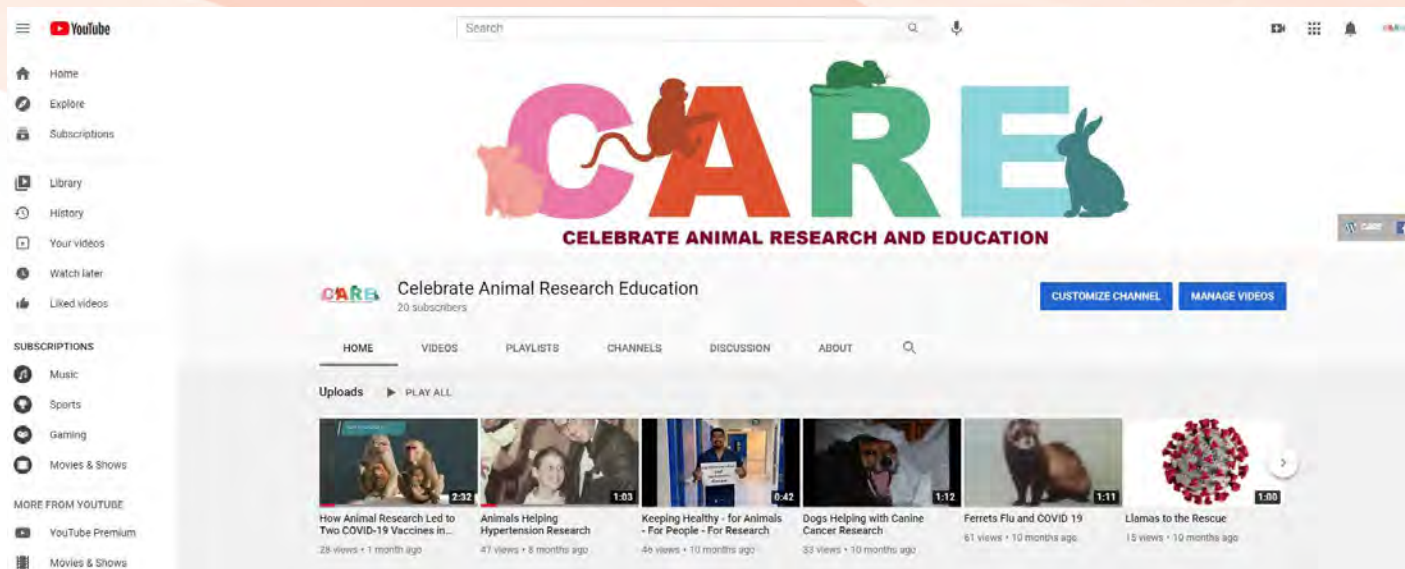

2020 PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS

The AALAS Foundation, a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization is dedicated to educational outreach on the essential role of responsible laboratory animal care and use in science to advance human and animal health. The AALAS Foundation develops educational materials, web-based public information resources and public awareness campaigns to inform the public about the compassionate professionals working in laboratory animal science and the importance of quality laboratory animal care to benefit medical progress.



CELEBRATE ANIMAL RESEARCH & EDUCATION (CARE) PUBLIC AWARENESS ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN

The AALAS Foundation continued its “grass-roots, social media public awareness efforts in 2020 by creating the “Celebrate Animal Research & Education” (CARE) YouTube channel. The Foundation developed eight new awareness videos for the YouTube channel. These videos highlight how animals have helped achieve medical progress.

Additionally, the AALAS Foundation continued its celebration of animals in research. The AALAS Foundation announced during the 2020 virtual National Meeting, the “Celebrate the Pig” campaign honoring the work of pigs (and people) for their work in cardiovascular research. Anyone making a \$10.00, or more, online contribution to the Foundation received a “Celebrate the Pig” lapel pin (a pig with its tail curled into a red colored disease awareness ribbon representing cardiovascular research).

The goal of the “Celebrate Animal Research & Education” (CARE) program is to convey the message that animals play an important role in the advancement of medical discoveries to help find cures and treatment options for catastrophic diseases. The “Celebrate the Mouse” and “Celebrate the Pig” lapel pins were developed as visual images to help convey the message of the vital role of animals in research. They also serve as conversation starters – allowing professionals working in laboratory animal science an opportunity to talk to the public about their passion for their job and the important work they do.

"CELEBRATE THE PIG" PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

"Celebrate the Pig" cards were developed to include "talking points" describing several ways pigs have helped advance cardiovascular research. These cards accompanied the "Celebrate the Pig" pins distributed to eligible 2020 donors.

Additionally, the AALAS Foundation updated its "What's Happening in Cardiovascular Research" Power Point presentation to include information conveying how pigs have contributed in cardiovascular medical progress.

These speaker-ready, fully scripted, presentations include speaker notes to make it easy for anyone to use at outreach events when speaking to the public. The presentations are available free to AALAS members and serve as tools to assist laboratory animal science professionals reach out in their local communities and speak about the important work being done in biomedical research and the important role of mice, pigs, – and other animals – in the development of new treatment options for catastrophic diseases.

The "Celebrate Animal Research & Education" (CARE) program also makes it possible for AALAS members to request "Celebrate the Mouse" and/or "Celebrate the Pig" lapel pins for distribution at eligible public outreach events.

Informational cards accompany each pin and inform attendees of the significant role mice/pig have played in research.



PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

The AALAS Foundation conducted a “Heroes in Biomedical Research” t-shirt and face mask public awareness campaign which ran from March through December 2020.

The goal of the campaign was to bring awareness to the public about all of the heroes working tirelessly in laboratory animal science during the COVID-19 pandemic.

AALAS members were encouraged to order and wear the t-shirt and/or mask as a way to help generate conversation and promote the important work of people and animals working in biomedical research. A total of 6,946 shirts and a total of 2,30 face masks were sold – raising a total of \$60,570 to help support the AALAS Foundation and its mission.



BRANCH RECOGNITION FOR PUBLIC OUTREACH

The AALAS Foundation’s annual award, the Public Outreach & Education (POE Award) recognizes outstanding public outreach efforts conducted by Branches. The Research Triangle Branch was named recipient of the 2nd annual POE Award because of its innovative virtual public outreach efforts.



OUTREACH AT EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCES

AALAS staff partnered with Americans for Medical Progress and exhibited at the 2020 USA Science & Engineering Virtual Expo. This virtual outreach event was attended by more than 75,000 K-12 and college aged students, teachers and parents.

Visitors to the AALAS Foundation’s virtual booth were able to download our educational materials, such as the “Animal Roles in Medical Discoveries” poster and “Careers in Biomedical Research” brochure. Additionally, visitors to the virtual booth were able to click on links to the Foundation’s www.kids4research.org and www.care.aalas.org website.



“ANIMAL FLASH FACTS” – EDUCATIONAL RESOURCE



The AALAS Foundation continued offering its educational public outreach tool for free to teachers/students – the “Animal Flash Facts” research trivia game. The “Animal Flash Facts” game challenges students to guess the correct animal model which helped scientists lead to medical discoveries. The game also consists of trading cards which contain photos of animal models and facts about how the animal model helped with scientific discoveries, in addition to “fun facts” about the animal.

The “Animal Flash Facts” research trivia game is available free in PDF format for AALAS members.

KIDS 4 RESEARCH WEBSITE



Funded by Charles River Laboratories, the www.kids4research.org site was developed to provide age-appropriate material to stimulate interest and understanding about our field. The website continues to serve as an important educational outreach tool for middle school age students and teachers – receiving an average of 5,000 website visits per month.

2020 NATIONAL MEETING – A SUCCESSFUL VIRTUAL YEAR FOR AALAS FOUNDATION

The AALAS Foundation held its first virtual only silent auction during the AALAS virtual National Meeting. generated over \$6,400 to support the AALAS Foundation’s public outreach effort. We appreciate all auction item donors and bidders who supported our virtual silent auction.

The “Best of Show” award was awarded to University of Texas Health Sciences at Houston – Designer: Jamie Greaver.

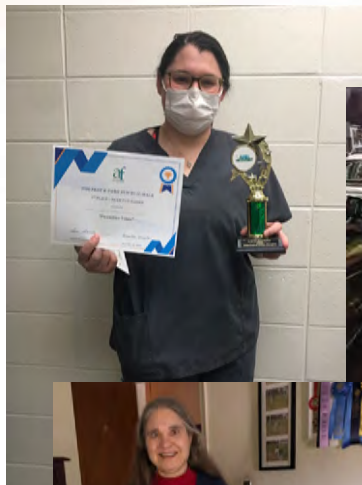


AALAS FOUNDATION BIPLANE BATTLE
