We were thrilled with the number of videos received in response to our "I Love Research Animals" video essay contest. The videos helped bolster the AALAS Foundation's CARE YouTube channel's growing collection of videos which serve to promote the important role of animals in biomedical research.

We continue to maintain and enhance our www.care.aalas.org website and the www.kids4research.org website.

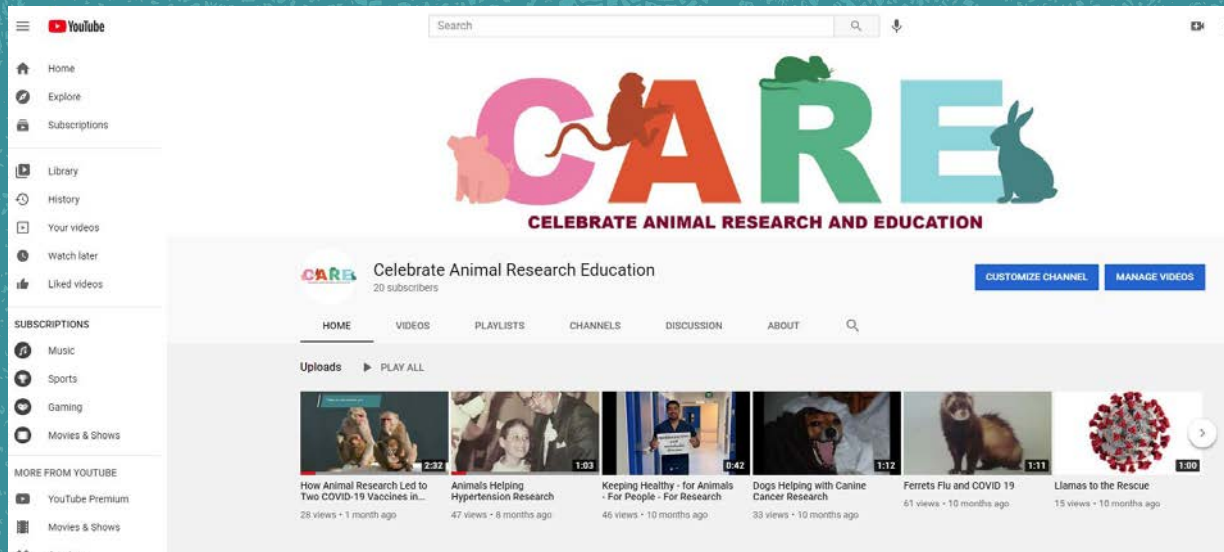

2021 PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS

The AALAS Foundation, a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization is dedicated to educational outreach on the essential role of responsible laboratory animal care and use in science to advance human and animal health. The AALAS Foundation develops educational materials, web-based public information resources and public awareness campaigns to inform the public about the compassionate professionals working in laboratory animal science and the importance of quality laboratory animal care to benefit medical progress.



CELEBRATE ANIMAL RESEARCH & EDUCATION (CARE) PUBLIC AWARENESS ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN

The AALAS Foundation continued its “grass-roots, social media public awareness efforts in 2021 by implementing an “I Love Research Animals” contest. The contest served to help add an additional twenty-six (26) videos to the Foundation’s “Celebrate Animal Research & Education” (CARE) YouTube channel.

Contestants submitted videos talking about their favorite research animal and why it is their favorite.

Stephen Stevens, an Animal Technician at USAM BIID received the most “thumbs ups” for his video entry entitled “I Love Non-Human Primates”, and was declared 1st place winner of the contest. Stephen received a \$100 Amazon gift card. Carrie Benton, Director, at Uniformed Services University was 2nd place winner and Cindy Buckmaster, Strategic Advisor, at Transnetyx, was our 3rd place winner.



Additionally, the AALAS Foundation continued its celebration of animals in research. The AALAS Foundation announced during the 2021 National Meeting, the “Celebrate the Monkey” campaign honoring the work of monkeys (and people) for their work in COVID-19 research. Anyone making a \$5.00 or more, contribution to the Foundation at its booth during the 2021 National Meeting, received a “Celebrate the Monkey” lapel pin (a monkey with its tail curled into a COVID-19 disease awareness ribbon.)

The AALAS Foundation was proud that the National Primate Research Centers chose to sponsor the 2021 “Celebrate the Monkey” public outreach program.

The goal of the “Celebrate Animal Research & Education” (CARE) program is to convey the message that animals play an important role in the advancement of medical discoveries to help find cures and treatment options for catastrophic diseases. The “Celebrate the Mouse,” “Celebrate the Pig”, and “Celebrate the Monkey” lapel pins were developed as visual images to help convey the message of the vital role of animals in research. They also serve as conversation starters – allowing professionals working in laboratory animal science an opportunity to talk to the public about their passion for their job and the important work they do.

“CELEBRATE THE MONKEY” PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

“Celebrate the Monkey” cards were developed to include “talking points” describing several ways pigs have helped COVID-19 research. These cards accompanied the “Celebrate the Monkey” pins distributed to eligible 2021 donors.

Additionally, the AALAS Foundation developed a “What’s Happening in COVID-19 Research” Power Point presentation to include information conveying how monkeys have contributed in COVID-19 research.

These speaker-ready, fully scripted, presentations include speaker notes to make it easy for anyone to use at outreach events when speaking to the public. The presentations are available free to AALAS members and serve as tools to assist laboratory animal science professionals reach out in their local communities and speak about the important work being done in biomedical research and the important role of mice, pigs, monkeys – and other animals – in the development of new treatment options for catastrophic diseases.

The “Celebrate Animal Research & Education” (CARE) program also makes it possible for AALAS members to request “Celebrate the Mouse,” “Celebrate the Pig” and “Celebrate the Monkey”, lapel pins for distribution at eligible public outreach events.

Informational cards accompany each pin and inform attendees of the significant role mice, pigs, or monkeys, have played in research.

This “Celebrate the Monkey” pin – with its tail forming a COVID-19 awareness ribbon – was designed by the AALAS Foundation to celebrate the monkey and the important role it has played in COVID-19 research.

Help us spread the word about how monkeys are helping make strides in advancing COVID-19 research!

Here are a few facts to share.
Monkeys are helping combat this pandemic because...

- They are similar to humans in their physiology, relative size and anatomy, making them suitable models to study the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the causative agent of COVID-19.
- The rhesus monkey is the leading model used for the evaluation and safety testing of vaccine models because it shares about 93% of their genes with humans and is required by the FDA for any cell based therapy or vaccine development.
- Rhesus monkeys are 100% similar to humans where the SARS-CoV-2 virus attaches to the proteins in the body.
- Rhesus monkeys also helped researchers understand the SARS-CoV-2 effect on the virus’ activity in the lungs and its impact on cells, tissues, and organs, which helps with search for COVID-19 vaccines and treatments.

PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

The AALAS Foundation conducted a “Caring for Our Vaccine Heroes” t-shirt public awareness campaign which ran from June – August 1, 2021.

The goal of the campaign was to bring awareness to the public about all of the professionals working tirelessly in laboratory animal science to care for the animal heroes who worked to advance medical discoveries for COVID-19.

AALAS members were encouraged to order and wear the t-shirt as a way to help generate conversation and promote the important work of people and animals working in biomedical research. A total of 398 shirts were sold – raising a total of \$3,753.40 to help support the AALAS Foundation and its mission.



BRANCH RECOGNITION FOR PUBLIC OUTREACH

The AALAS Foundation’s annual award, the Public Outreach & Education (POE Award) recognizes outstanding public outreach efforts conducted by Branches. The Texas Branch was named recipient of the 3rd annual POE Award because of its many virtual public outreach efforts conducted by several of its members.



OUTREACH AT EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCES

AALAS staff exhibited at the 2021 “in-person” Future Farmers of America Expo in Indianapolis, Indiana. AALAS member Beth Ann Skiles volunteered at the booth and helped inform students about the amazing career opportunities available in the field of laboratory animal science.

Over 50,000 FFA members from around the country attended this event. Students visiting the AALAS Foundation booth were able to play the “Research Animal Trivia” game to learn how animals have helped scientists achieve major medical discoveries.



“ANIMAL FLASH FACTS” – EDUCATIONAL RESOURCE



The AALAS Foundation continued offering its educational public outreach tool for free to teachers/students – the “Animal Flash Facts” research trivia game. The “Animal Flash Facts” game challenges students to guess the correct animal model which helped scientists lead to medical discoveries. The game also consists of trading cards which contain photos of animal models and facts about how the animal model helped with scientific discoveries, in addition to “fun facts” about the animal.

KIDS 4 RESEARCH WEBSITE



Funded by Charles River Laboratories, the www.kids4research.org site was developed to provide age-appropriate material to stimulate interest and understanding about our field. The website continues to serve as an important educational outreach tool for middle school age students and teachers – receiving an average of 5,000 website visits per month.

2021 VIRTUAL AREA PROGRAM

Students participating in the program were introduced to the various career opportunities available in biomedical research and participated in a facilitated discussion lead by AALAS member, Dr. Chandra Williams, about the pros and cons of animals in research.

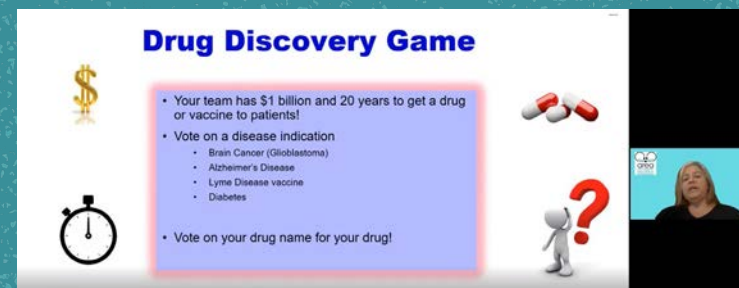
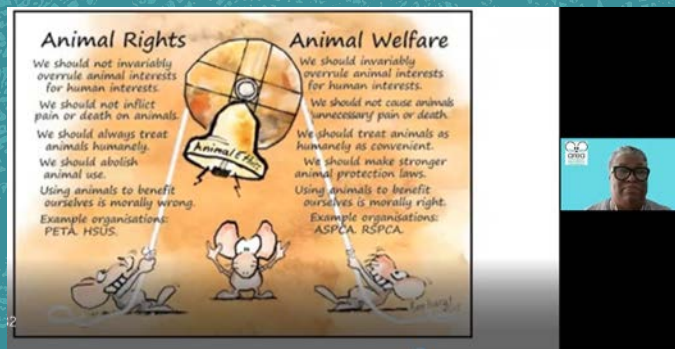

Survey results from students and teachers attending the program indicate the virtual AREA Program was a success and that it provided students with a better understanding and acceptance for the need of animals in research.

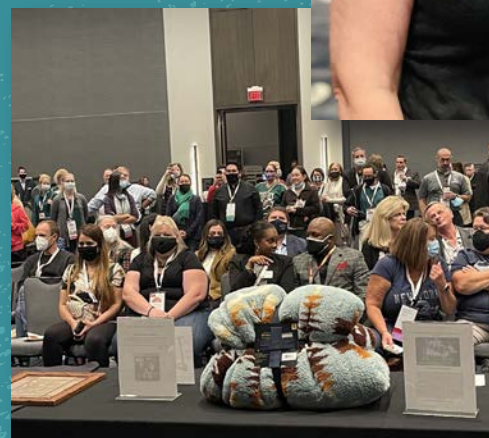

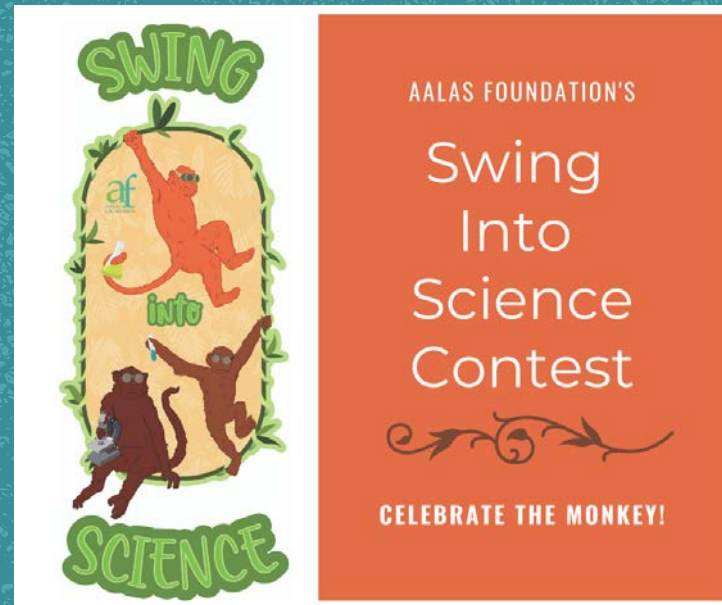

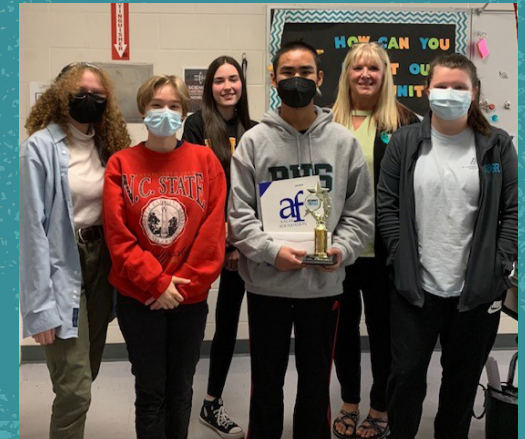
